7.1.7 Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly (at least five)

Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly (at least five)

1. Restricted entry of automobiles beyond parking area inside the campus in order to prevent air and noise pollution, and encourage use of Institutional Bi-cycles for internal mobilization.
2. Our Institute is well recognized for Plastic free Campus. We banned reuse of plastics and plastic bags inside the campus.
3. Pedestrian-friendly pathways with tree shadows.
4. Landscaping with trees, plants, and Herbal Plants. Aarupadaiveedu Medical College & Hospital situated on the Pondy - Cuddalore NH road 12 kilometre from the Pondicherry town. It is a sub-tropical terrain plain to pho land with a campus of 40.57 acres and it is corrected as one of the Green Educational Institutes in Pondicherry with Flora and Fauna diversity. The campus is now quite clean, green and has less pollution compared to the rest of the city. The campus is frequently visited several natural enthusiasts to observe the Birds on the campus as well as adjacent to Bahour lake. Campus revealed a wide managing floral diversity. The plants belonging to sawed habits like epiphytes, climbers (4 nos), Grasses (Korean grass covers 7000 Sq.Mt; St.Augustian grass covers), Herbs (878 nos), Shrubs (7046 nos covers 2944 Sq.Mt), Tree saplings (120 nos) and Trees (1021 nos covers 19449 Sq.Meter). The plants belonged to 49 different families and total 190 species of Flora in the campus.
5. All internal circulars in the Institute are sent through E-mails, in order to save papers and also all Departments are encourage to reutilise the one side printed papers for printing various other material.
6. Stressing all the staff to utilize water what so ever quantity is utmost required only and also Minimizing the electricity consumption by making practice of switching off light and fan whenever people leaves the room.
7. Bio-medical wastes, Solid wastes, & E-wastes are collected in different color-coded bags as per schedule 1 in adherence to Biomedical Wastes (management & handling) rules 2018. Pondicherry solid waste management company Private Limited (PSMPL) is the authorized common biomedical solid waste management facility by Pondicherry Pollution control committee.
8. Daily the Garden workers will be engaged in removing debris, litter, and trash from landscape & Garden area
9. Encourage application of organic fertilizer like top dressing of cow dung manure and good earth etc.,
10. Effluent sewage water treatment was done on daily basis @ 500 KLD (5, 00,000 litres capacity), and was utilized for watering the trees, plants, shrubs, and grass etc.,
11. Daily 22,000 litres of RO drinking water is produced using Reverse Osmosis plant in the campus with storage capacity of 40,000 litres.
12. Rain water Harvesting is installed in our campus to raise the ground water level naturally.
13. Our buildings are constructed in such a way to access natural sun light and air circulation inside.

1. Title of the practice: PRACTICE READINESS ASSESSMENT FROM OUTGOING STUDENTS

2. The context that required the initiation of the practice (100 – 120 words):

The Medical Education is increasingly focusing on graduate outcomes.

In this context competency based Medical Education has been introduced in 2019 – 20. The focus of CBE (CBME) is to ensure that the graduates attain the necessary competencies – knowledge, skill attitude and communication, so asked perform the professional activities required of them – entrust able professional activities. Any improvement in the curriculum, Teaching – Learning Assessment and course design requires measurement of graduate outcomes / achievement of program outcomes, this is the starting point of curriculum revision and redesign.

3. Objectives of the practice (50 – 60 words):

To self – Assess the ability of the outgoing medical graduates to

i) Perform Essential Professional tasks (EPA)

ii) Check the competencies across various domains and learning such as medical knowledge, communications, team work and self-directed learning

4. The Practice (250 – 300 words):

The World Federation of Medical Education (WFME) has listed a list of 50 activities, any medical graduates, from any part of world should be able to perform at the end of his / her under graduate training at the completion of course. These skills encompass variety of competencies including

i) Medical Knowledge

ii) Patient care – Competencies that meet to be achieved to ensure that a quality / satisfactory / safe care is provided to the patients.

iii) Interpersonal communication skills and team work including communication with patients and family, communication within members of professional team

iv) System based practice – using resources in the system to achieve best outcome for a given patient

v) Practice based Learning and improvement – To ensure that continuous professional learning takes place, improving the outcomes and ensuring a steep learning curve.

vi) Professionalism – ability to carry out the above activities in a manner acceptable to professional colleagues

vii) The Instrument – Based on the WFME outcomes, a self-study questionnaire was constructed, validated by MEU experts. The outgoing students have to self-access their abilities across the range of competencies. The questionnaire has 57 questions. All responses are graded based on the following Likard scale

5 – Can teach others

4 – Can perform Independently, but can't teach

3 – Can perform under overall guidance

2 – Can perform only under step by step guidance

1 – Can't Perform

The questionnaires is administered to the student in the last week of the CRRI training. All responses are blinded. The ability of the CRRI across various competency domains is calculated using weighted mean.

A score of ≥ 3 is taken as satisfactory achievement of the program outcome (Annexure 1: Questionnaires on practice readiness) professionalism and interpersonal work are assessed at the end of each clinical rotation using a structured format.

An analysis of results is done and shared with all the HOD of the CRRI training departments and the administration.

5. Obstacles faced if any and strategies adopted to overcome them (150 – 200 words):

Obstacles: Strategy to Overcome:

1) Development and validation of questionnaires Literature Search; Attending professional accreditations CPDs using MEU resources to validate the questionnaires

2) Suitable slot to administer the questionnaires After discussion in the college council, decided to do so in the last week of CRRI posting

3) Ensuring the CRRI are open and honest about the self-rating a. The importance of feedback is explained to them at the beginning of the session

b. All responses are blinded

4) Co-relation to the program outcomes Equality self-assessment of competencies is only the first step to measure program outcome. It needs to be subjectively measured.

6. Impact of the practice (100 – 120 words):

Following the analysis and sharing the informer – focused training session have been introduced to ensure that the CRRI receive training in following areas where their competencies needed to be improved

i) BLS training – All CRRI currently certified

ii) ACLS training

iii) Suturing Techniques – Workshops by General Surgery

iv) Team work and time management – Specific small group sessions by the student Councillor

v) Communication skills including – Workshop on communication skills – "Breaking bad news" have been conducted to all CRRI in small groups to ensure that this vital areas is addressed.

vi) The Interns oriented program is also extended for the additional batch students. The Department also conduct focused, regular training session at their level to ensure that the course outcomes are achieved.

Example:

Intra – Venus Line Insertion, & New born Resuscitation by the department of Paediatrics.

Future Plan:

Our AVMCH is providing free service to the public in Health related issues. All investigations like Hematology, Radiology (X-Ray, USG, Color Doppler, Mammogram, CT scan, & MRI), Serology, Micro-Biology, Bio-Chemistry and Biopsy were done at free of cost for both Out-Patient, and In-Patient cases. The free Vehicle was sent to all adopted villages at weekly basis for transportation to AVMCH for treatment and also provide free food and Medicines. The major Surgery were done at free of cost (Tamil Nadu Chief-Minister Health Scheme) with free medicines, food (for one patient attender also), and the hospital stay. Through AnnaiAnnapoorani Maternity & Child Welfare Scheme free delivery with seed money of Rs.10, 000/- (Ten thousand only) was given to each patient, and also free vaccination for the child born at AVMCH.

Weekly free public, & School camps were organized and conducted regularly in the adopted villages of AVMCH situated around our Institute (Ariyankuppam, Pagaram, Kirumapakkam, Embalam, Koothapakkam, Vissor, Muthantikuppam, Nallathur, Vandipalayam, Valluvarmedu). The Department of General Medicine, General Surgery, Obstructive Gynecology, Pediatrics, Orthopedics, ENT, Ophthalmology, and Dentistry were involved in the camps for Awareness and Screening. The Patients indicated for Major treatment or Surgeries were referred to AVMCH.

Free yearly Master Health Check-up is provided to all Teaching, Non-Teaching, and Students of AVMCH, VMCON, SAHS, and School of Physiotherapy.

Free Ambulance service is provided to under privileged, and economically poor patients who were referred to Higher Centers for Specialized treatment and also free pick-up from their location in emergency situation to the nearby Medical Centre.

The screening Health Camps were conducted to General Public regularly and Special camps were conducted to Old Age Homes, Mentally Challenged Homes, Physically Challenged Homes, and Orphanage Homes.

Private Organization like Equitas, Rotary Club, Lions Club, Yahweh Arakattalai, YagavaArrakattalai, Pondicherry Multi-purpose Social Service Society, Jeevanaram Foundation, Udayam SCSC Trust, Aulugum Trust, BOWDA Social Welfare Group, Radhakrishnan Community care & Educational Trust, Helpage India, AmbedkarArakattalai, and NGO's like BLESS, NULM, ManithaNeyam, were associated with AVMCH Camp Team has conducted Many Public & School camps and also arranged for a Venue, & Place to conduct camps with all necessary accessories, transportation, & Food for Doctors & Staffs.
